Treasurer's Report: Bank balance: \$1,306.18. Rebate from National \$50.90.

Next Board Meeting: Will be on March 9 at Mary Knudson's.. Betty suggested that the date and place of the next Board meeting appear on the front page of the newsletter before any other meetings.

Legislative: Action was urged on the following; FY2011 the federal funding bill in which all federal

programs are being considered for cuts; SB1246 which would force a woman to undergo an ultrasound, even if it is not medically necessary, before she can access abortion care; SB1265 would block state funds to any health care provider who even refers anyone for abortion care. Congressional phone number: 1-866-997-6651.

Golden Apple: Vivian Wood and Ann Timmer will take care of this award which we plan to present to Sister Margaret McBride who gave her approval for a procedure to save a woman's life at St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center.

NOW National Conference: This year it is being held in Tampa, FL, June 24-26. For those who registered before 2 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 10, a special registration fee of \$19.66 in honor of the founding year of NOW, was offered. NOW Membership Mtg Feb 2, 2011 Meeting called to order: Jacklin Lindfors **Treasury** Report, Ann Timmer: \$1310.58. **Visitor:** Shelly Hornbeck, volunteer for Planned Parenthood, spoke of NOW's historical support for PP, and for the luncheon, which is on February 25. She is our newest member, having been a NOW member in the east valley, and now living in the west valley. Welcome!

Legislative: Connie Hupperts: 1^{st} Action Alert: Congressional Representative Chris Smith's bill to redefine rape by narrowly defining it to be only for forcible rape (and also whittles away at Roe v Wade). Contact Rep Trent Franks to vote against it. 2^{nd} Action Alert: The senate has now attached the Affordable Health Care Bill to an Aviator Bill. Senator Kyl's amendment limits Cancer care to less than life time. Contact Senators to vote against these amendments. Betty Roberts will look into cost for ads in the Republic, against these bills. ACHCCS cuts are deep. Illegal Immigration issues: Nestle and Hershey ads are problematic, suggest boycotting them.

Golden Apple Award: Voted to offer it to Sister Mary, of St Joseph's Hospital, in the episodic case of the interests of the gravely ill pregnant mother vs her 7 week old fetus.
