3 Women Share the Nobel Peace Prize

The Nobel Committee has awarded the 2011 Nobel Peace Prize to three women for working to promote democracy, security, and women's rights. Liberian President Ellen Johnson-Sirleaf, Liberian activist Leymah Gbowee, and Yemeni opposition leader Tawakkul Karman will split the \$1.5 million prize.

Nobel Committee Chairman Thorbjørn Jagland praised the women for "their nonviolent struggle for the safety of women and for women's rights to full participation in peace-building work."

Clarence Thomas in violation of Ethics

Thomas has flouted the law for years by failing to disclose his wife's substantial income despite being legally required to report it. That is why U.S. Representative Louise Slaughter is demanding that the Judicial Conference, an administrative arm of the court, uphold the Ethics in Govt Act by referring Thomas' apparent misdeeds to the Attorney General for further investigation. Rep. Slaughter has written a letter about this to Chief Justice John Roberts, who is the presiding officer of the Judicial Conference.

After a luscious salad luncheon provided by the Board, Co-Coordinator Jodie Lawrosky called the meeting to order at 1 p.m.

Golden Apple Award: Ann Timmer gave a brief history of the Golden Apple Award. She then introduced our guest speaker and Golden Apple recipient, Dianne Post. Vivian Wood made the presentation to Dianne, who expressed her thanks and pride in receiving the award.

Dianne spoke about her work in Kenya this year with the United Nations while writing a manual for prosecutors on sexual and gender-based violence. She will be returning to Kenya shortly to continue her work.

She told us of the presentation of a film "In Her Shoes," on Sunday, October 30 at the UMOM Day Centers, 333 E. Van Buren, in Phoenix from 1-3 p.m. The film portrays the life of a battered woman. Admission is free and light refreshments will be served.

Dianne mentioned a group "Raising Glasses" which organizes fund-raisers for organizations, such as ours. Her own group "It's Your Choice" helps battered women to make a choice as to their future. Tax-deductible contributions were requested and for those who couldn't make a contribution today, the address of "It's Your Choice" is 1826 E. Willetta, Phoenix 85006. Note: \$376 was collected for It's Your Choice and \$100 for Kenya Girls.

Dr. Gabrielle Goodrick, a family physician, was introduced and spoke of the health care crisis facing Arizona women. It is not good, and if we are not vigilant things will get worse.

NOW Book Club: Ann spoke of the Book Club selection of the month *All That is Bitter & Sweet* by Ashley Judd, which will be discussed prior to the November meeting on the 2nd. Another book mentioned which would be of interest to us was *Rose's Will* by Denise Decio, which Dianne and several others praised.
