Get Money Out

Here's the miserable truth about our current political system: Corporations & individuals can spend unlimited amounts of money, in total secrecy, to sway elections & buy access to politicians. The courts have given them this power (Citizens United), allowing them to manipulate, strong-arm, and essentially bribe our government.

Nearly 80% of Americans think our democracy is being bought and sold, that it's time to get the money out.

Tens of millions of people know that something needs to be done about it. Something Big. Now. Like amending the Constitution.

Past efforts to limit political contributions (like 2002 McCain Feingold reform law) were too small & were undermined by the courts. The 2012 elections are projected to cost over \$6 billion, double that of 2004, four times higher than spent in 2002.

The Supreme Court's 2010 ruling on Citizens United says that corporations are people & can contribute unlimited funds. Super PACS are pouring billions into political campaigns, anonymously. Giant corporations are controlling the President, Congress, Health "reform," the wars, Wall Street, the Banks, the Supreme Court, at the expense of the public interest. Fraud is rampant (causing our economic depression since 2007) and the Justice Dept is not prosecuting those responsible because the politicians need the campaign donations of the perpetrators (and forget the public good).

There are two ways to amend the Constitution, but only one has been used in the past. An amendment can be passed by two-thirds majority in both the Senate & House of Representatives, and then ratified by three-quarters of the 50 states. That's some heavy lifting by any count.

The second has never been done, but some believe it's the only way to fix the money-in-politics problem. Two-thirds of the state legislatures officially vote to hold a Constitutional Convention, where representatives from each state gather, and amendments are proposed. Three-quarters of the 50 states must ratify an amendment. It is a difficult process.

Thousands of amendments have been proposed over the years, but only 27 have been ratified and made into law. At the website www.unitedrepublic.org, at least 14 amendments are listed, offered by various Democrat Congresspersons and progressive organizations.

These amendments seek to reverse Citizens United, say corporations are not people, limit campaign contributions to \$100, give Congress the power to regulate political contributions, some prohibit

corporations from any campaign spending, establishes public funding for political campaigns, affirms citizens right to vote, declares election day a federal holiday. I have been following the Dylan Ratigan Show on MSNBC at 2:00 PM where he is crusading to "Get Money Out."

It is encouraging to hear of all the efforts being made toward this goal, to heed the msg of "Occupy WallStreet." I urge everyone to check out his program & the website (mentioned above) & other internet sites that are pushing the ideas of the 99%, taking back the country, away from corporate control, and curtailing money's ability to buy power. All the amendments are seeking citizens to sign their petitions to go forward. You might feel inclined to sign up. **The editor**
