In an effort to make a difference in Arizona, AZ NOW wants to encourage our members and friends to become more actively involved in our community and state government by educating them about what our legislators are doing. Following is an important issue!

Message from Dianne Post, AZ NOW Legislative Chair:

HCR2012- ratification of ERA in House - not assigned. Need letters, phone calls, emails to Speaker of the House:

Action: Assign HCR2012 (ERA) to the government committee immediately so that it can be heard (more favorable than judiciary).

SCR1003- ratification of ERA in Senate - assigned to government unfortunately chaired by John Kavanagh.

Treasurer, Erwin: Bank balance \$1139,89. Consensus to gradually withdraw from Wells Fargo to the Amtrust Bank. Hupperts and Modeen will also sign on the bank card, as also on Wells Fargo.

Giving **stipends** to speakers: If unable to find out if mileage is paid by the sponsoring organization, then check (which will be made out ahead of time) will be made out to the individual speaker--who may then donate it to their organization. A stipend to be given to only one speaker, even if two also attend.

Our chapter will buy prepaid **postage cards** to hand out when each person is to send messages to our elected representatives. Erwin also suggested that a letter be developed and everyone could sign on to it and then it could be sent.
