Asia Foundation Finds

More than 8000 women in India are killed every year over dowry disputes. In Asia, honor killings, lynching of women branded as witches, archaic practices of banishing menstruating girls and women to sheds in remote parts of Nepal, resulting in some dying from attacks by wild animals or from snake bites—add up to more women being killed than in war, said Patrick Barron of the U.S. based non-profit The Asia Foundation after a two year study. **Reuters CModeen**

WHM: Luci will see if the docent from the Phoenix Art Museum can speak on art of women through accomplished women through the ages. Carolyn to check on the AZ woman in Oracle to speak on women for Women's History Month. Anita says we can give up to \$200 to a speaker. Dates to have Women's History Month: March 10 or March 28.

Discussion about Tolleson declaring an adoption of the UN Convention CEWAW. Since no one in our chapter lives in Tolleson, it would lack credibility for our chapter to encourage this.

Sending postcards to legislators re the clause in NAFTA that allows corporations to sue governments for harm to their finances remains to be done. Next meeting?

We are collecting pill bottles to be sent to Africa for use in their dispensing of pills. We will bring our empty pill bottles to a designated meeting and a member of NOW will separate by sizes and send off.

The next two meetings we are to bring men's clothing, women's hygiene supplies, & reading glasses for the CASS shelter where Doreen volunteers. Application forms to apply to Planned Parenthood to volunteer to accompany women to get past the picket lines for the abortion clinics can be picked up at our front desk.

It was decided to bring items for the homeless shelter where Doreen Royer volunteers, bringing items in November and December. Most needed are men's clothes; women's hygiene items such as pads, tampons, wipes, & reading glasses. Interest from the group in learning more about Tolleson as a possible town that would adopt the Convention for the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women CEDAW (from the UN). We will ask State NOW more about it so that we might be able to work on this. For three Monday evenings, Bonnie Saunders is using the book by Rev. Barber of the Moral Mondays in North Carolina. She spoke about ordering the book from Amazon for \$9.00 and coming to her seminar. From the 19th Amendment celebration this past August 26 comes the emphasis on working for the Equal Rights amendment. State NOW has a movie, Equal Means Equal. Further discussions about actions we all have taken over the summer took place. **CModeen**
