We need your help! For the past month, we've been working with Central Arizonans for a Sustainable Economy (CASE) to register new voters and to get existing voters switched over to the state's convenient vote-by-mail system. Thus far, results have been good;

our members have been responsible for approximately 65 registrations. But we need more! We've set an organizational goal of 250 registrations by the end of the year, and while that may seem like a tall order it's achievable -- but only with your help.

Signing up new voters is a numbers game -- the more "asks" we make, the more registrations we're going to get. (And since we're seeking voters in areas populated by likely progressive voters, the more beneficial we expect our efforts to be.) To this point, however, it's been just a small handful of our members who have hit the parking lots, stores, and parks to find these voters.

If you haven't signed up to participate in one of our twice-weekly registration drives, *please*, *please*, *please*, *please* consider doing so. Don't worry -- you won't be sent out there alone and unprepared. CASE and Desert Progressives will provide you with the training you need prior to your going out to collect signatures (trust us -- it's not very complicated) at specific, assigned locations. In addition, you'll be working with at least one experienced partner who can help show you the ropes once you're out there.

We'll be discussing voter registration at the monthly Desert Progressives meeting on Tuesday, Nov. 28. Please attend, and why not bring a friend who's been looking for a way to ACT to push back the darkness? **Kathleen Abernathy**

Key talking points for Katie Hobbs' supporters

What we need in the Secretary of State's office is someone who will be a champion for voters and is ready to hit the ground running on day one. Katie is that person.

Katie has a track record of leading with results to back it up, both in and out of the legislature.

As a social worker, she helped lead a non-profit organization to become one of the largest domestic

violence shelters in the country, serving thousands of victims and their children each year.

If she didn't do her job as the chief compliance officer, the organization would lose funding, have to close beds, and wouldn't be there for women facing a dangerous time in their lives. Katie took this responsibility very seriously and is ready to use this management experience to turn around the mismanagement in the Secretary of State's office.

Katie led Emerge Arizona for 3 and a half years, recruiting and training Democratic women to run for office.

In the legislature, she stood up to an ethically challenged colleague from her own caucus, resulting in his removal from the legislature.

Katie ran for the senate and won (in a landslide) against a 16-year incumbent.

Katie has twice been elected by her peers to lead the Democratic caucus in the Senate.

Katie fought to help pass Medicaid expansion, providing healthcare to hundreds of thousands of Arizonans. Katie introduced a bill on sexual assault evidence kits that led to the creation of a task force that is solving the rape kit backlog in Arizona.

Katie has led the charge against the relentless GOP attacks on women's healthcare.

Katie has fought against numerous attacks on voter rights, including the ridiculous "ballot harvesting" bill, and bills that undermine our constitutional right to citizen initiative.

As a candidate for Secretary of State, Katie has stood up to the incompetence in the office that is undermining the integrity of our elections.
